

Checklist to take a CCP course at your high school 2021-2022

Before you participate in any college programming, you must complete the College Credit Plus registration process with Columbus State Community College (CSCC). Be sure to complete each step below to finalize your registration in a CCP course offered at your high school. If steps are not completed, your course request will be flipped to a high school course.

- Watch the [CCP Nuts and Bolts video](#) and complete the electronic Intent Form.
- Register for the course(s) on your high school registration sheet and in PowerSchool.
- Apply to CSCC as a CCP student **using your personal email address** – <http://tiny.cc/CSCCapply>
 - After you apply online, an email confirmation with a Cougar ID will be sent to the email you registered (generally within 3-5 days of applying).
- Register your Cougar ID number with your school counselor.
- Submit placement scores to CSCC - **deadline is May 3, 2021.**
 - **Using the SAT/ACT?**
 - Submit your ACT scores directly to CSCC Admissions Office - ACT code: 3261
 - Submit your SAT scores directly to CSCC Admissions Office using SAT code: 1148.
 - **Planning to take the Accuplacer Placement Test?**
 - After registering a Cougar ID with WCS, students will have an opportunity to indicate if she or he is interested in taking the Accuplacer in Westerville. Interested students will be contacted once testing dates are set.
 - You may choose to attend a testing center on the CSCC Westerville Campus or Main Campus. Information about CSCC testing center hours and locations can be found on CSCC's website at <http://www.cscce.edu/services/testingcenter/>. You will receive a score print out at the testing center and should bring this to your school counselor for interpretation and to complete course registration.

Stay tuned for more testing info. CSCC Testing centers remain closed as of 1/1/21 and the college is using unweighted GPAs of 3.0 for eligibility and placement.
